Take into account that you have to be at the airport at 13.00, earlier if possible if you do not want to give me a heart attack, so plan carefully if you want to do something in the morning.

Airport: **82A** will leave us at the Dolby. There is a bus every half hour. I think the Airlink 500 would be another choice. We'll ask when we arrive.

Tickets cost about £2.5/3. Make sure you either have change or pay in groups of 3/4.

A cab is also an option. It would cost about £20-25, but we could share a cab among four or five.

You are going to walk from the hotel to the Metropolitan Cathedral. It is a 15/30 minute walk (depending on how fast you are!) so calculate your time properly. The Metropolitan Cathedral is very easy to find since it is on high ground and is pretty visible, but ask at the hotel desk for a map and directions. The university is just opposite the cathedral, so I'll meet you at the cathedral and we'll proceed to the lecture. You should arrive a half hour before the lecture (at 9.30) so that they can take us to the lecture theatre without interfering with the other students.

The City Explorer open-bus sightseeing tour is not booked since they told me it is not necessary at this time of the year (we may be the only ones facing the weather!). I do not know at what time exactly we'll be leaving for the Albert Dock, so it would not have made sense to book anyway. We'll try our luck since there is a tour leaving every half hour. The tour is of about 50 minutes.

You will have to take the Mersevrail train (ask at reception at the hotel for directions to your closest station, which is James Street): Wirral Line (green) direction to **Elsmere Port** and stop at **Port Sunlight**. See a network map following this link: https://www.mersevrail.org/ com mon/map/networkmap.htm It is a twenty minute ride, approximately. Also, take into account that the walk from the hotel to the station is of about 15 minutes (approximately) so calculate your time properly. I'll be waiting for you at the train station in Port Sunlight. Buy a **return ticket**, though we will stop at Liverpool Central on our way back (the return ticket is valid for all the Liverpool stations, that's why you do not have to specify the station you'll stop at on your way back, just say a return ticket to Port Sunlight). The price of a return ticket is £4.05.

We will take a cab from the hotel to Anfield Football Stadium. It costs about £10. Since we are sharing among 4 or 5, this means that we will be paying £2.5 each, which is cheaper than the bus ticket.

We'll take a cab back to the Walker. It will be more or less the same price as the cab from the hotel to Anfield.

For drinks, beer, one of the agents at the tourist information office has suggested The Bierkeller at Liverpool One. Both he and the receptionist at your hotel have suggested Liverpool One as a place to go hunting for (cheap) food.
